



Alphabet Picture Mnemonic Chart

The Pre-K Alphabet Picture Mnemonic Chart provides an engaging, research-based way to introduce letters and their corresponding sounds for Pre-K learners. Instead of individual cards, all alphabet mnemonics are displayed together on a single one-page chart for easy reference and whole-group instruction.

Each letter on the chart includes both an uppercase and lowercase form. The lowercase letter contains an embedded picture of a keyword that clearly represents the target sound. This built-in picture mnemonic acts as a scaffold to help students connect letter names to letter sounds and strengthens retention through consistent, explicit practice.

The chart is designed to support clear and consistent instruction. Teachers can guide students in identifying the letter, naming the keyword image, and producing the associated sound. Because all letters are visible at once, the chart also supports frequent review and helps students begin to recognize patterns across the alphabet.

This chart can be used to explicitly introduce new letter-sound correspondences and to review previously taught letters and sounds during whole-group or small-group instruction. Once students can consistently name letters and their corresponding sounds using the embedded keyword images, they should transition to practicing with letters that do not contain images in order to build independence and prepare for fluent reading and spelling.
