Suffix -ed Word Sort: Burger Edition

- Print and laminate all burger pieces for durability.
- Cut out the burger parts and mix them up.
- Students sort the burger parts into groups based on the sound of suffix -ed: /t/, /d/, or /ɪd/.
- For each sound, students build a cheeseburger using 5 burger parts.
- Pack each completed burger into the correct paper bag labeled /t/, /d/, or /ɪd/.
- Store bags for future review and repeated practice year after year.

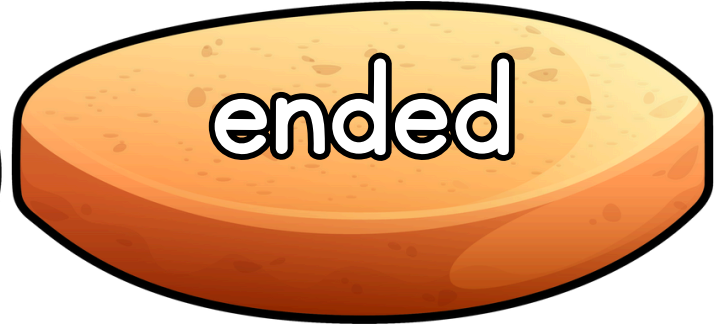
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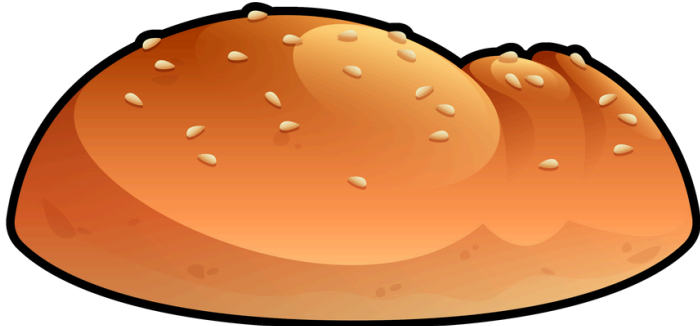
