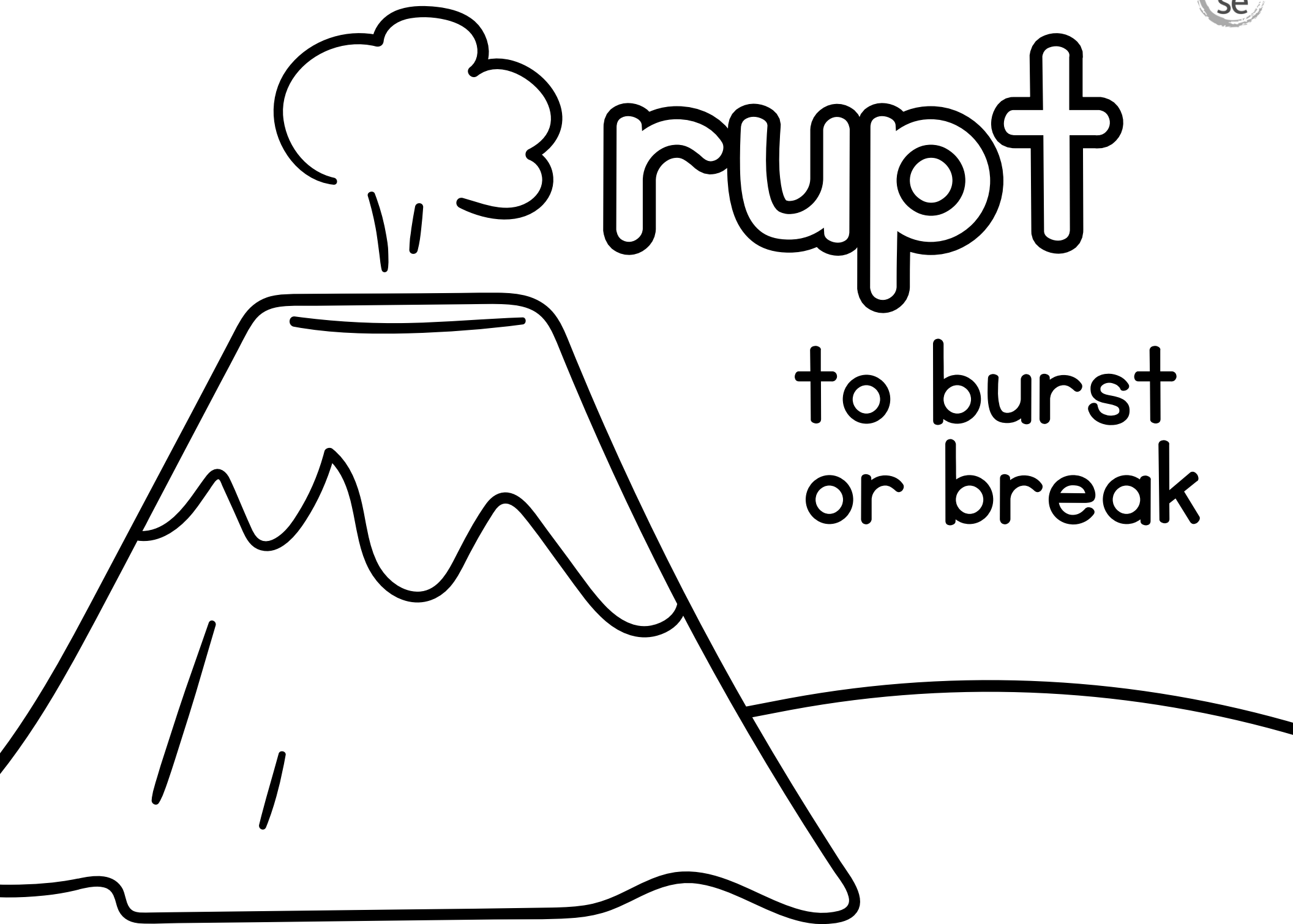


Freebie Directions

5. Use them as reference tools during reading and writing activities.

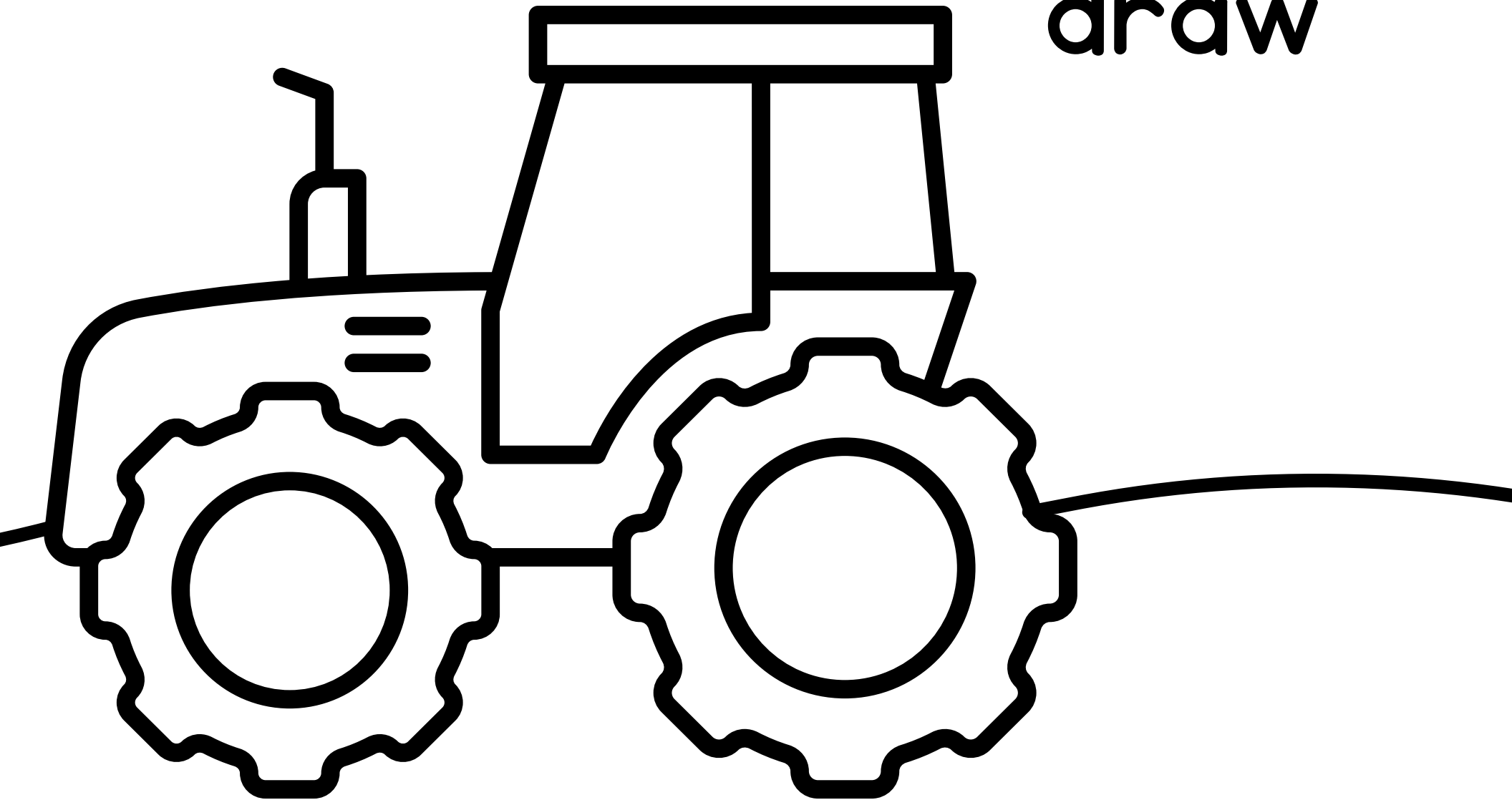
